



Tagging & Presentation Suggestions

Affixing Tags & Presentation Suggestions

1. ALL items must have a tag attached. All clothing must be on a hanger (wire preferred, not required)
2. **Print Tags using the DRAFT/LIGHT print mode. The lighter the barcode, the better it scans.**
3. Tags can be attached with a safety pin OR with a tagging gun. If utilizing a tagging gun, please use SHORT barbs (about 1" or less). Make sure the barb goes through the tag where it says "pin here." You may use two barbs per tag to help ensure it does not fall off, if desired. Refer to the "Consignor Homepage" of our website for a link to purchase inexpensive tagging guns. This is optional, not required! (Be sure to mention Three Bags Full. Tagging guns will cost \$6.50 which includes barbs, fyi).
4. **Use CLEAR PLASTIC DUCT/PACKING TAPE when a safety pin will not work.** Place one long piece of tape directly across the front of the tag, in between the solid black lines. (The "pin here" and the barcode will not have tape on them.) **Scotch tape will not last and your tag will end up lost. PLACE TAG ON THE OUTSIDE of the bag, box, etc.**
5. BOOKS & MOVIES: either place books in a clear plastic bag with the bag taped shut OR tie them together from spine to edge and from top to bottom. Multiple books become lost from their partners unless they are SECURELY kept together. Again, scotch tape will not last and your tags will become lost.
6. SHOES: either use a tagging gun barb or a large safety pin to pin them together. If that is not possible, rubber band them together. Small infant shoes can be placed in a Ziploc bag, with the bag taped closed.
7. Pieces/parts to that toy your kid loved? Place them in a Ziploc bag, tape the top closed and SECURELY tape the bag to the entire main toy. (Example: Little People playsets... tape the bag with the people to the castle, farm, etc). CLEAR PACKING TAPE needs to be used. Scotch tape will not last and your pieces will end up all over the sale.
8. Freshen clothes that have been stored with Febreze, etc. If really wrinkled, iron it. (I know...where is the iron?) ☺
9. Sell outfits when possible, instead of items. You can even safety pin socks, ties, hair clips to the shoulder of the outfit.
10. When hanging outfits:
 - Use a wire hanger if possible
 - Place shirt on hanger so the hook of the hanger faces left.
 - Turn the shirt/hanger over. Place pant on top of hanger. Safety pin the waistband of the pant to the shoulder of the shirt, being sure to catch the hanger on both sides. Face the front of the pant out so that it can be seen.
11. Anything needing a battery must have a working battery in place for it to be consigned. Pick up cheapies at the Dollar Store.
12. Need hangers? Ask your local Laundromat or Dry Cleaners for wire hangers.
13. Use Clorox wipes, febreze, etc to quickly clean up items.
14. A little worn? A little outdated? If you're not sure it should probably stay home. Choose wisely as all items will be inspected at drop-off. Unacceptable items that get through the drop-off process may later be pulled and will automatically be donated.
15. The nicer your item looks, the more you'll get for the item and the quicker it will sell. Always think: "Would I purchase that item, in that condition, at that price?"
